Joe Lavage passed seven yards to Chuck Edwards with three minutes left last night to enable Helix High to gain its fifth straight victory with a come-from-behind triumph over Hilltop High, 19-14, on the victor's field.

The Highlanders drove 80 yards for the deciding touchdown with Lavage pitching his second touchdown pass. Lavage tossed 15 yards to Edwards in the second period to give Helix a 13-7 halftime advantage. Nelson Powell blocked a Hilltop punt to set up that score.

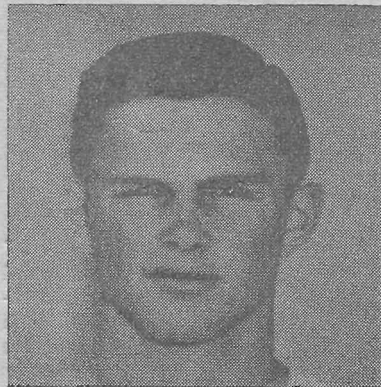

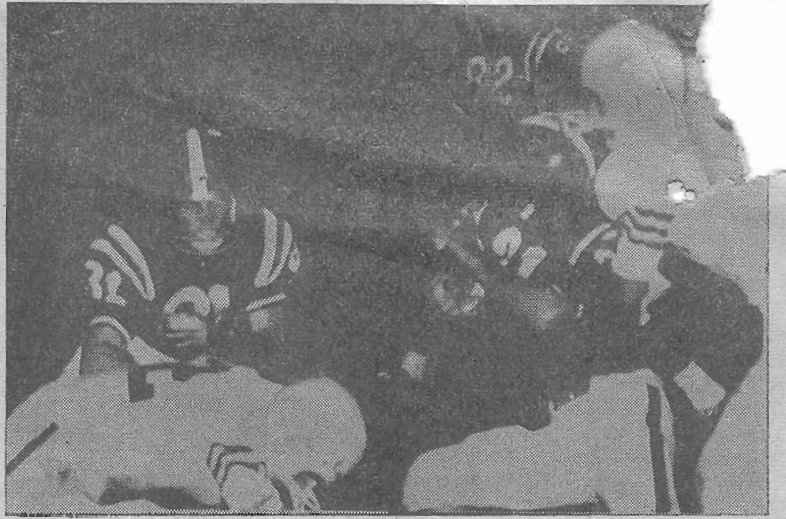
Edwards Chosen Athlete Of Month

Playing an integral part in this year's undefeated Scot football season is Chuck Edwards, senior, Athlete of the Month for October.

"Chuck has come up with some very key plays and fantastic catches which have significantly contributed to Helix's winning season," head football coach Dick Gorrie, said.

Edwards caught a quick pass over the goal against El Capitan with 35 seconds left in the game to put Helix ahead, and two weeks ago snatched a short pass in the second quarter to score Helix's first touchdown against Granite Hills. Against Grossmont, he set up the touchdown for Helix by catching a pass deep in Foothiller territory.

Starting as a member of the Frosh team, Edwards has developed over the years into a fine player. As a junior, he played fullback in his first year on the varsity squad. This year Edwards is a flanker-back, and his "key clutch catching" will continue to play a major role as Helix defends the championship.

Scots Hurl Hilltop, 19-14, Meet Monarchs Tonight

Helix again came through in the clutch to triumph over Hilltop, 19-14, in a non-league encounter last Friday evening on the Highlander field.

This win gives Helix a 5-1 overall slate, leaving the Scots' 4-0 first place league record unaffected. Tonight at 8, Homecoming, Helix will host last place Monte Vista on the Scot field.

The Lancers scored in the first period when Hilltop's Joe Ruenzel ran 10 yards around right end for the touchdown. The extra point was good, placing Hilltop ahead, 7-0.

After 3:15 of play in the second quarter, Helix halfback Byron Olander made a spectacular 69-yard run over the goal.

A minute later, Helix's Nelson Powell blocked a Lancer punt, which the Scots recovered on the Hilltop 15. The next play, a 15-yard goal pass from quarterback Joe Lavage to Edwards, put Helix ahead, with the extra point, 13-7.

A 10-yard goal pass to Lancer Dave Grey and the extra point brought Hilltop a brief lead, 14-13. After the Lancers kicked, Helix was downed on its own 20.

Through a series of runs by Olander and Bruce Thompson, and catches by Edwards, the Highlanders plowed forward 80 yards, a siege which was climaxed over the goal with 2:30 left in the game by a 7-yard pass from Lavage to Edwards.

Scots Flip Eagles

A week earlier, Helix rolled over Granite Hills 19-7 on the Helix field by exploding for two touchdowns and an extra point in the second half. After a scoreless first period, Helix quarterback Barry Bronk snapped a 15-yard pass over the goal to Edwards after four minutes of play. Later in the period, Granite Hills recovered on the Helix 2, ran over for the score, and booted the extra point, to lead 7-6 at the half.

Midway through the third quarter, Powell recovered a Granite Hills fumble on the Eagle 1. A quarterback sneak by Lavage and an extra point pulled Helix ahead, 13-7. With 30 seconds remaining in the game, Powell intercepted an Eagle pass and ran 20-yards for the touchdown.

Helix Nips Grossmont

Helix spoiled Grossmont's Homecoming three weeks ago as the Scots nipped the Foothillers 10-7 at Aztec. With 3:25 left in the first quarter, Helix recovered on the Foothiller 28 and scored a field goal. During the second period, Don Renwick of Grossmont ran 20-yards for a touchdown, and Grossmont gained the extra point.

With 1:30 left in the game, Helix pushed 55 yards to the Grossmont 7 on a 35-yard pass to Edwards and a 20-yard run by Dick DiMeo. In the last 35 seconds, Olander ran over for the score. The extra point rounded out the Helix victory.
